So we all know what it's about?



• It's about the Government wanting to get rid of CHCs.

And they have done it!

All sorts of reasons have been given, no one really knows why.

But the day will soon be here!

It's been a long war!

- The original proposals were crazy, but have changed dramatically as a result of a strong campaign by ACHCEW and CHCs.
- We gained many improvements but...
- CPPIH seem intent on doing it their own way...
- And are getting away with it!

So while we won many battles, I feel we have now lost the war!

- My greatest fear is that the new system will fail!
- All the dedication and skills of CHC staff and members will be lost!
- CPPIH are determined to re-invent the wheel!
- It's not just that they are getting away with it.
- And they are taking far too long in setting up the "new" system!

So where is CPPIH now?



- Well I think I know the answer.
- I'm not sure that
 carers, the public or
 patients do.
- I'll try my best to explain.
- But, it's not easy because it is so fragmented!

First let's look around.

- Wales, CHCs have been reformed not abolished!
- They are forging ahead at great speed!



Scotland is also going to change!

- Health Councils will lose many of their important roles.
- Here too they seem intent on destroying the system...
- But seem to want to keep the staff and members.
- At least they seem to be organised, unlike England!

So most of you know what WILL happen in England?

- ACHCEW WILL be abolished along with CHCs on 1st December 2003.
- CPPIH will take over PPI.
- The office in Birmingham is moving.
- The Chair Sharon Grant and the Chief Executive Laura McMurtrie will be totally free to do their own thing...
- Without fear or favour!

So what is CPPIH doing so far?

- They are (finally) recruiting people to become members of 'Patient Forums'.
- A massive task and if the information I have is correct they are finding it difficult!
- They have yet to decide on terms and conditions for members!
- They have yet to re-invent that wheel!!

Local Management systems.

- Advertisements are out for staff to manage the Patient Forums.
- Problem is that because there are so many different contract holders it is very confusing!
- E.G. Age Concern 75 years...The Scouts, etc.
- Those interested in PPI or Health don't give it a second look!
- So the "new" system is way behind target!


Then there are:

- Local Network Providers!
- They have won the Contracts to support the Patient Forums Service.
- To call them "local" is stretching it a bit!
- To make matters worse these LNPs have some strange names...
- The public will...
- Are already totally confused...
- Is that the aim...I wonder!

What else was CPPIH supposed to do?

- Performance management of all Patient Forums...
- No, that's now the LNPs
- Employ all the staff of Primary Care Trust ('PCT') Patient Forums who will also provide staff support for other Patient Forums...
- No, that is to be done by contractors...
- Such as Age Concern, CABs, etc.
- Makes you wonder why CPPIH need so many highly paid staff!

I really don't know why they are doing it this way!



At local level there should be:

- PCT Patient Forums.
- Acute Trust Forums.
- Mental Health Forums.
- Ambulance Trust Forums
- Plus many more.
- About 640, one in every Trust.
- Minimum 7 members that's 4480 volunteers!

- PCT Patient Forums
 were also to provide
 advice on complaints
 -'ICAS'- Not now!
- Ensure that "hard to reach" groups have their say on health.
- Collect information on health services in their area.

The new system is already failing!

- Don't forget that all these new bodies were to be in place "before" ACHCEW & CHCs were abolished!
- The Minister, Secretary of State AND Sharon Grant gave assurances in Public!
- The fact is they have not got a chance!
- My worry is what happens to Carers, Patients and the Public?

Don't forget that PFs are.

- Members drawn from various sectors:
- Voluntary sector
- Patients
- Carers
- NO local authority appointments
- Only now is CPPIH seeking to bring on board CHC Members!

What of the great idea that each Patient Forum will elect a member to become a Non-Executive Director on the Trust Board?

- That idea seems to have gone?
- You may recall that it was said that "Most PCT Patient Forums will need to deliver some of their functions jointly".
- The way things are going they will have to...
- Because there are not enough Members

But Patient Forums must

- Monitor Services provided by its Trust.
- Seek the views of Patients in its Trust.
- Inspect premises where NHS services are provided or arranged by its Trust.
- Make reports & recommendations.
- Refer matters to 'OSCs', 'StHAs', 'CPPIH', 'CHI', etc.

We all know that...

• But how can they do it by 1st December 2003?

 At this moment in time they are thousands of members short!

- Yet they still refuse help...
- They are still trying to re-invent the wheel!

Are you still with me?

Or becoming confused and concerned?



Well just think about this...

• So far I have touched on only a small part of the "new improved" system.

• There is much more!



There are the 'PALS'

- These will be in every Trust, employed by the Trust, they will:
- Resolve problems on the spot!
- Provide information to Patients, Carers, and their families about health services and support services and support groups.
- Explain how to complain and where to go.
- Act as an early warning system for Trusts.

Great System – well...

- ACHCEW has undertaken two major surveys...
- Needless to say PALS is nowhere near up and running in every Trust.
- Even where there is a telephone contact...
- It's often an answering machine or...
- Staff have no idea how to advise persons wanting to find an advocate!

If this continues then

- Patients will have nowhere to turn to.
- The legal profession will have a field day.
- It will cost millions in compensation claims.
- The public will lose faith in the NHS.
- NHS staff will be in fear of the "blame" culture.
- In other words...DISASTER!

Then there are the OSCs

- Overview & Scrutiny Committees.
- They should:
- Take on the role of scrutiny of local health services.
- Be able to call NHS Managers and Chief Executives to explain service provision, etc.
- Be consulted on Major changes to services.
- I must admit I don't know how many are up and running and dare not ask!

As you can guess I'm not very impressed!

- We have all been misled!
- The CHC movement.
- The Voluntary Sector.
- Members of the House of Lords and Commons.
- But worst of all Carers, Patients and the Public!

So there should be...

- Patient Forums for every Trust
- CPPIH, new national body with a co-ordinating role over PFs.
- PCT PFs with allocated staff and members from other PFs.

- ICAS.
- PALS.
- OSCs.
- 7000 volunteers.
- Estimated costs £86m.
- CPPIH started in Jan 2003.
- It seems to be working very slowly!

So what do I think?



So much for 'Transition'

- Transition Advisory Board ('TAB') made recommendations to Department ignored!
- CPPIH got the report ... ignored!
- ACHCEW was seeking a genuine transition from CHCs to PCT Forums, including transfer of staff & members (those who want to play a role)...IGNORED!

So when will it work?

- I really do not know....
- That is why I am very concerned.
- We all know that...
- All it needed was to reform CHCs!
- The huge budget (rumoured £86million) will all come out of frontline services!
- That means Carers, Patients and the Public will suffer even more!

Yes I fully admit... I am not very pleased!

• What can be done?

• There is a slim hope that if thousands of people like you... CHC members and staff join the new system...

• You can pick up the pieces when it falls apart!

If you still care...

- Get in touch with CPPIH.
- Push and push to get appointed to a PF.
- Urge as many "caring" people who you know to do the same.
- Once there push and push to make the system work!

Before I conclude...

- I would like to thank you all for the hard work, skill and dedication that you have brought to your roles within the CHCs.
- To urge you to remember all the major changes that have come about because of your efforts.
- To remember that thousands if not millions of people have benefited because of your efforts.
