EXCITING AND INNOVATIVE CONFERENCE TO CHAMPION USER AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN LONDON'S PRIMARY CARE SERVICES

'PRIMARY CARE IN LONDON – AN UPDATE. DEVELOPING GENUINE PARTNERSHIPS'

Monday 28th June, 1999

Health service users, carers, representatives from London's voluntary sector and Community Health Councils, lay representatives of Primary Care Groups and patient participation groups are to attend a conference next Monday, the aim of which is move users and public involvement in planning and monitoring primary care services in the capital, right up the agenda. The results of discussions will be written up in the form of a good practice manual which can be used by all the groups above, including the newly established Primary Care Groups.

Sue Towns, GLACHC Director comments, "This isn't going to be another "talking shop", we really want to come out of the day with some positive, practical action points, and examples of good practice on which to campaign for genuine partnerships between those who provide primary care services, those who use them, and those who are excluded from using them".

Participants will be given an up to the minute report on primary care services in London, look at the new role of Health Authorities, Primary Care Groups and Trusts in the 'New NHS', here what primary health care interventions Black communities want, look at why some Londoners are excluded from using the services, and explore ways of genuinely involving users and the public in primary care groups.

Speakers include: Dr. David Colin Thome, Director of Primary Care, NHS Executive London; Dr. Tanya Eber, Marylebone Primary Care Group; Gary Francis, Director of Uplift Drugs Prevention Project; David Panter, Chief Executive of Hillingdon Health Authority. The conference chair is Annabelle May, Journalist and Health Policy Analyst.
